In 2011, the gender gap at KS1 was 1.5 points (national 0 points); at KS2 the gender gap was 2.8 points (national 0.1 points).	By July 2016

Improve boys' attainment in English, especially writing.	gender		X		To increase boys' attainment in English, especially writing	English subject leader All class teachers	The average point score of boys in English at end of KS1 is no more than 0.5 points behind that of the girls, and at KS2 is no more than one point behind that of the girls. In 2011, the gender gap at KS1 for reading was 0.1 points (national 1.2); for writing at KS1 0.7 points (national 1.5); at KS2 the gender gap for English overall was 1.8 points (national 1.5 points).
